

# The George receives planning permission in Catford

bptw has recently secured planning permission for the redevelopment of the George Public House, a new build residential development in Catford.

The scheme, submitted by bptw partnership on behalf of London & Quadrant Housing Trust, comprises the demolition of the existing public house and redevelopment of 35 residential units.

Situated on the edge of Catford town centre, the former coaching inn, which dates back to 1870, was once a thriving pub, now vacant. The proposed development will create a landmark corner to the street, on the main route into Catford town centre.

Designed by Yurky Cross Chartered Architects, the development will deliver a high quality residential scheme which will consist of 22, one bedroom, 10, two bedroom, and 3, three bedroom self-contained flats, together with landscaping, 35 bicycle spaces and car parking spaces, including 3 disabled car parking spaces with access onto George Lane.

To ensure a successful fit with the surrounding context, careful consideration has been given to the character of the surrounding area, in particular the two-storey residential properties to the east of the site.

The George is situated in a gateway location to the city centre and will be serviced by transport links on the edge of Catford town centre.
